



Smiles for Life: Data Snapshot

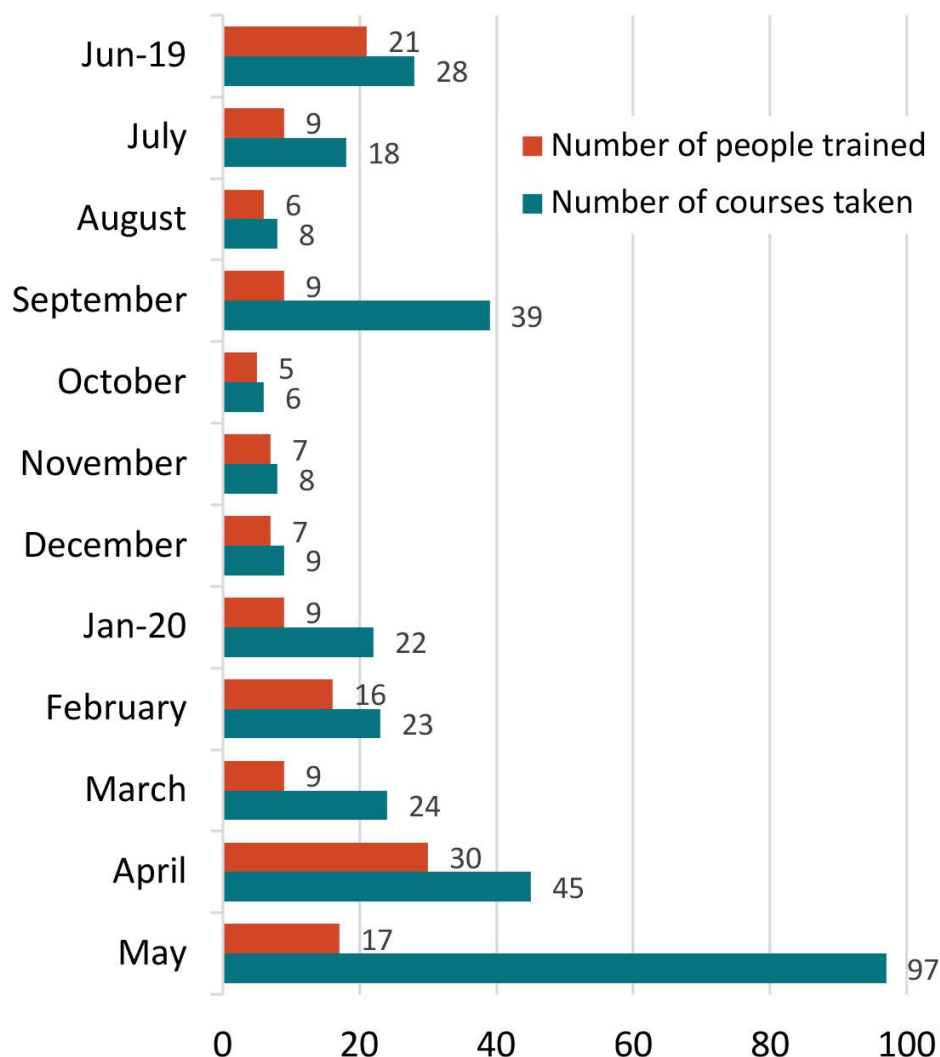

- Adult Oral Health
- Acute Dental Problems
- Pregnancy and Women's Oral Health
- Caries Risk Assessment, Fluoride Varnish and Counseling
- The Oral Exam
- Geriatric Oral Health

Number of People Trained and Courses Taken June 2019 - May 2020



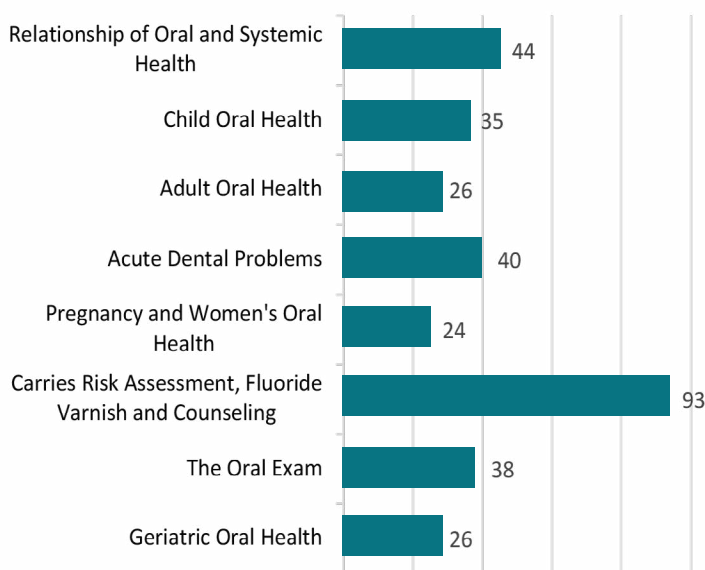
138 professionals were trained June 2019 – May 2020.

The curriculum is designed to enhance the role of oral health in all health professions. The most common profession among those completing at least one course in the last 12 months was nursing (64%).

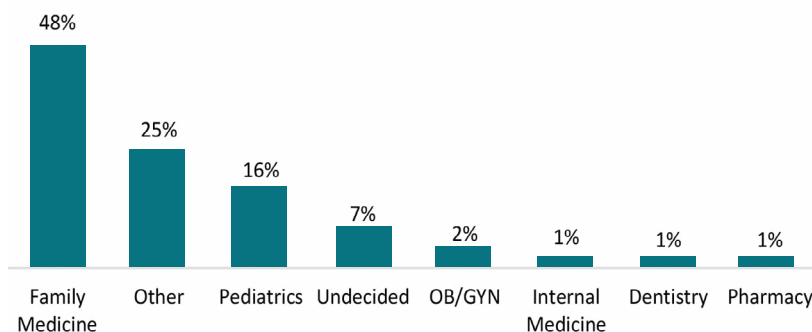
Most popular course: Caries Risk Assessment, Fluoride Varnish and Counseling.



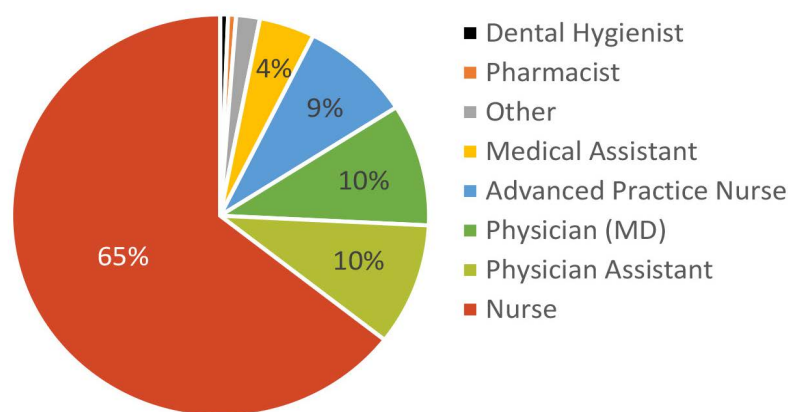
Number of People Completing Each Course, June 2019 - May 2020
